CO-OP'S 87th Anniversary Annual Meeting Held August 21

Consumers Energy celebrated the cooperative's 87th anniversary on Thursday, August 21, 2025, by hosting an Annual Meeting at its headquarters facility in Marshalltown. Over 180 member accounts were represented with members and guests there to hear speeches and reports. Elected to three-year terms for the co-op's Board of Directors were: Bill Hobson of Marshalltown, Ken Grant of Nevada, and Craig Griffieon of Ankney.

The Nominating Committee met on April 29, 2025, to begin the nomination process for director candidates to fill the vacancies created by the expiring terms of Bill Hobson, retiring director Arden Greiner, and Craig Griffieon. The Annual Meeting meal was catered by Hy-Vee serving pulled pork sandwiches, chips, fruit, bottled water, and ice cream treats. Entertainment at the event included Education Program fun. The Annual Meeting began at 6:00 p.m. with President Denny Beckman presiding over the meeting. Reports were presented by Secretary-Treasurer Pat VonAhnen, Nominating Committee/Election & Credentials Committee Chairperson Loyd Nelson, and CEO/General Manager Bridget Itzen. The 2025 Youth Tour representative, Jake Buell, provided a video of his experience in Washington, D.C. in June of this year.

Co-Op Members Assist Others Through Operation Round-Up® Program

Consumers Energy's members contributed \$2,040.30 to the cooperative's Operation Round-Up Program from July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025, that was distributed to local community action agencies. The cooperative was able to assist 13 families who needed economic assistance with their energy bills. Currently, 249 members are donating funds to Operation Round-Up.

Operation Round-Up is a program designed for members who wish to donate small change each month to cooperative members who need economic assistance with their energy bills. Members who sign up for this program can have their monthly electric bill rounded up to the next highest dollar or specify an exact dollar amount to contribute monthly to the program. The co-op then annually distributes the Operation Round-Up funds to local community action agencies to assist low-income families with winter heating bills and winterization of their homes.

How does the Operation Round-Up Program work?

There are two options for participating in Operation Round-Up. The commitment chosen would be effective with the month's bill following receipt of the Authorization Form.

- Each month Consumers Energy "rounds up" the electric bills of participating members to the next highest dollar. For example, a member's monthly bill of \$160.73 would automatically be rounded up to \$161 with the additional 27 cents going to the Operation Round-Up
- Another option available for this program allows members to specify an exact dollar amount to be contributed each month.



We're giving your monthly electric bill a fresh new look starting in November. The updated design was created to make your bill easier to read and understand, while still giving you all the important information you expect.


What's changing:




Navigating Your New Electric Bill


Follow the numbers below as a guide to reading your new billing format.

- 1. Amount due on account.
- 2. Your account number. Please refer to this number when calling in or making payments.
- **3.** Billing Summary shows activity since last billing.
- **4.** Message Center for important messages from Consumers Energy.
- **5.** Meter location and meter reading information.
- **6.** By following the graph key, you can see monthly usage and can compare your usage with the previous year.
- 7. Current detail of charges.
- **8.** Account number and amount due. Return stub with your check or cash payment.
- **9.** Ways to pay online and on our SmartHub app.We accept Visa and MasterCard, Discover and American Express.

On the reverse side of the bill, you will find a place to update personal information that appears wrong on the front side of your bill, information on signing up for SmartHub, and additional information on ways to pay your bills.

Daylight Saving Time ends

The end of daylight saving time is a great time to go through your fall home maintenance checklist. Here are some items to include:

November 2



RESET THE TIMER ON YOUR WATER HEATER

CHANGE YOUR SMOKE DETECTOR BATTERIES

- · Check the expiration date on fire extinguishers and replace if necessary.
- Change the rotation of your ceiling fans to rotate clockwise at a low speed
- Remove hoses, and shut off exterior faucets
- Add weatherstripping around window and door frames. Get door sweeps ready.
- Measure attic insulation. It may be time to add more
- Inspect your garage door(s)
- · Remove any items from the garage that may freeze.
- Clean dryer vents.
- Schedule chimney cleaning and heating system maintenance.
- Replace furnace filters.
- · Care for trees and shrubs.
- Rake leaves
- Clean gutters and downspouts, and inspect your roof
- Make exterior repairs
- Seal gaps where critters could enter
- · Check walkways, railings, stairs, and driveways for winter safety,
- Start thinking about stocking up on winter supplies
- Check your home for radon. Fall is a great time to check it! As the weather gets cooler and windows stay shut more,
 radon is more likely to get trapped in your home.
- Apply for rebates if applicable.
